Deadline for Submission of Materials: May 31, 2009

Please note that materials must be *received* by May 31, and not postmarked by this date. 2009/2010 application forms should be ready by March 2009. Please be kind enough to contact us not earlier than February 15 so that we may send you a packet.

The Scholarship/Leadership Development Office will only be able to process *current* application forms, marked "2009/2010" in the lower left-hand corner of the first page. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for a National Leadership Development Grant, you must be:

- ◆ a member of a racial or ethnic minority, and a US citizen or a US permanent resident,
- ◆ admitted to or have applied to an undergraduate study program, in an accredited or approved institution of higher education, and
- ◆ able to demonstrate evidence of financial need.
- ◆ High priority is given to members of The United Methodist Church.

PLEASE NOTE: The following are not eligible to apply:

- ◆ Global Ministries' staff, directors, and mission personnel,
- ◆ UMC bishops (active or retired), and
- ◆ family members of any of the above.

Overview

Through National Leadership Development Grants, Global Ministries strives to aid individuals in developing their community/church leadership potential and to provide educational opportunities for racial and ethnic minority students through undergraduate study in accredited academic institutions. Global Ministries' goal is to equip persons for leadership involvement in the life and mission of the Church, as well as service to communities in need, in the following prioritized areas of emphasis: elimination of poverty, expansion of global health, leadership development, or congregational development. The NLDG is a competitive program with a varying number of new recipients per year, depending on the availability of funding. The scholarship range is from approximately \$1,000 – \$5,000, depending on the students' related needs and the school expenses. The specific financial request *must be substantiated* by an official school budget.

Please note that funding is for the acquisition of only one degree, and that submission of an application does not guarantee a scholarship award. Students will be notified in writing in Oct/Nov 2009 as to the outcome of the application process.
